- Retter From the government came for her father to clean for the Germans.

- □ Depurated from Poland to Skarzysko Kamienne



Skarzysko-Kamienne

- Mrs. Katz spent 5 years working.

- when the Russians got too close to Poland.

- While Mrs. Katz was in the labor camp she had help from a Gestapo Nurse.
- She also would recommend Mrs. Katz to get a better job.
- Real This Nurse saved Mrs. Katz life a few times.

- Cleaned men's barracks
- Cooked and Clean for a Gestapo Nurse







Munitions Factory

™ This was Mrs. Katz first job.

She and twelve other girls worked all day every day.



Hospital

- [™] Worked there for awhile.
- R Harsh Conditions.
- Was exposed to many different things.



Men's Barracks

- Moved onto cleaning the mess barracks after working in the hospital.
- One day and inspection came by the head Gestapo.
- ™ Mrs. Katz was then asked to cook.

While Mrs. Katz was Cleaning, and working she worked for the Gestapo Nurse.



Evacuated to Germany



- When the Russians got to close to Poland, Skarzysko-Kamienne was evacuated to Germany.
- Once there Mrs. Katz could no longer wear her own clothes.
- ™ But she kept her job.
- She describes it as, "They picked up and moved to Germany."

Typhoid

- While Mrs. Katz was in Germany, she got typhoid fever.
- She remembers that her cousin who had the same name had it too.
- She became unconscious when the fever became to high
- While she was unconscious, guards came to take her and her cousin to be killed.
- But Gestapo nurse had told them that Mrs. Katz was a hard worker.
- ™ Mrs. Katz was saved

Evacuated to Leipzig

- Thief was before liberation where all the prisoners of the camp were 'Walked to Death'.
- went to get a piece of grass to eat or got sit down, you were shot."
- They were also walking past the battle fields.
- "We say the bullets and everything" said Mrs. Katz



Sanatorium

- Mrs. Katz was taken here to be nursed.
- This is where she started to eat more frequently.
- She had teaspoon a day.
- The reason she was feed like is, was to stretch her stomach.
- Many other survivors died because they dug into food and didn't stop.



Liberation and Going Home

- Mrs. Katz was liberated just outside of Giebelstadt, Germany.
- ∞ In April 27 1945.
- Mrs. Katz wanted to go home because she thought that someone in her family would be alive.
- Once Mrs. Katz got back no one in her family had lived through the Holocaust.
- She then ran into her neighbor, who was the Mayor of Poland who told her to run and that 3 Jews have already been killed.
- The Reason they were killed, was because the people who had taken their homes were scared that they were going to take them back.

Going Home

- office incase someone was looking for her.
- [™] No one ever did.
- She later decided to go back to Germany.
- She then ran into a girl that was in the camp with Mrs. Katz.

Getting Work After the War

- Mrs. Katz had even finished public school.
- So she didn't know how to read or write.
- She wanted to be a telephone operator, but since she hadn't been able to finish school she couldn't.
- Mrs. Katz then got a lead on a job and went for it.
- ™ It was a job to be a guard in the women Jail.
- She took a 6 week high school course and graduated.

Working In The Jail

- While she was working in the jail Mrs. Katz, realized that she couldn't treat the women prisoners like she had been treated.
- She then had saved up enough money and deduced to leave Poland and go back to Germany.

Israel

- Once Mrs. Katz was in Germany she contacted a Jewish group that would help her.
- She was supposed to go to Israel but couldn't yet.
- But before this could happen Mrs. Katz went into a Displaced Persons (DP) Camp.

DP Camps

- Mrs. Katz went to was in Fuerstenfeldbruck.
- While she was there she was able to learn new skills.
- One skill that she learned was sewing.



Finding Family

- ™ Mrs. Katz had received a not that said there was some of her family in America.
- But later Mrs. Katz found out that it was Actually Canada and here family was in Toronto.
- She Then got in contact with her family.
- Her family wanted to bring her over the Toronto so they could be together.

Getting Papers

- For Mrs. Katz to go to Canada she had to be 17 and under.
- By this time Mrs. Katz was 19-20 and wans't allowed in.
- Now for Mrs. Katz to get into Canada she needed to take her cousins identity.
- ⊗ But the all ready had the same name it was just for her age.
- ™ Her cousin was 17 and no one knew about her death yet.
- The government had given Mrs. Kats the papers and she could go to Canada.

Canada

- So her stuff went to Israel and she went to Canada.
- Once she got to Canada she moved in with her Aunt.
- She then had to go and learn English.
- She picked it up very easily, that is one thing that Mrs. Katz prides her self in.
- Then Mrs. Katz got a job working in a factory.

Social Life



- In Toronto there was a 'New Comers' club.
- This was were all the refugees would gather and hangout.
- Mrs. Katz had started to date one man who later proposed to her.
- But Mrs. Katz did't like him as a husband and more as a friend.
- So she declined his proposal.

Social Life Con't



- One night her and her ex-boyfriend/ friend went to a party.
- Where one guy kept calling Mrs. Katz a very affectionate name.
- Mrs. Katz asked him why he was calling her such an affectionate name when his girlfriend was right next to him.
- ™ But the man did come over to Mrs. Katz's group.
- He then told her friend, "Why did't you introduce me to such a nice girl before."

Social Life Con't



- ™ Mrs. Katz and that man who would later become her husband and the father to her children, got her phone number and asked her out the next night.
- They then became very happy with each other and got engaged in the May of 1950, and married in June.
- They bought a house and wanted a family right away since they didn't have anyone.
