I arrived in Thessaloniki, Greece in mid-July (2014) for a try-out with a second division team (Iraklis) of the Greek Football League. Training went well and I was offered a contract to sign with the first team. The summer went by very quickly and there were many decisions that had to be taken just as quick! Soccer was just one aspect of my life in Greece; both of my parents were adamant about continuing with my education and that led us to Pinewood - The American International School of Thessaloniki, which is where I am currently attending and finishing my grade 12 school year. Thessaloniki which is the second largest city of Greece is beautiful and I have enjoyed it so far. The largest adjustment I had to make was being away from home, my family and friends. Living in an apartment, I had to learn very quickly how to do things (get around the city, shopping, food and cooking, laundry) that were

taken for granted in the past.

Life has been exciting for me so far and quite demanding. Balancing the daily training sessions with school responsibilities requires time management that I deal with constantly. Thankfully, the staff at my school are very accommodating and similar to the supporting and caring teachers that I was lucky to have at Crestwood. I also have a couple of team personnel who take excellent care of me. Currently, the team is sitting in first place in the league (in our division) and we have just qualified for the semifinals of the Greek Cup. Our target and my hope is for the team to get promoted to the first division next year. I still plan to continue with my post-secondary education but probably not on a full-time schedule. I am also planning to return to Canada in mid-June for about a month which is the time off we get before the pre-season begins for next vear!
