Grade Level Challenge Raises over \$4,000

For a week this January, Crestwood students joined together in friendly competition to raise money for a great cause and to win a grub day for their grade. The Crestwood Scholarship Foundation raises money to help bring students to Crestwood who couldn't otherwise be here. From January 12 to the 17, each grade came together to compete against each other and to help out this great cause.

It wasn't about how much money each grade donated, but about how many students participated in the charity drive. Students were asked to donate an amount that was at least equivalent to their grade level. The response was overwhelming and the competition for the grub day was fierce. Each day it seemed like the grade 9s would take the lead, only to be overtaken again by the grade 8s.

Ultimately, the grade 9s won the competition with 91% participation, narrowly beating out the grade 8s who had 89% participation! Several homerooms, including Mr. McCluskey, Mr. Tanev, Mrs. Pagano and Ms. Cooper had 100% donation rates.

Crestwood students raised over \$4,000 for the Crestwood Scholarship Foundation in the challenge and helped deserving students experience everything Crestwood has to offer. As Student Body Co-President Aaron Jackson put it, "The Crestwood Scholarship Foundation is a cause that brings amazing students to Crestwood so they can simultaneously thrive and better the Crestwood community." For a week this January, all the grades competed against each other, and everybody won!
