Students from Crestwood Preparatory College will highlight their Oral History Project. Over the last decade, it has brought war veterans and survivors and students together to record, document and preserve personal testimonies from and about the war. Mr. Masters and his students are proud to have the opportunity to present their multimedia findings at the Legion, where so much of this work began.

Scott Masters is a teacher at Crestwood Preparatory College, where he founded and presently directs the award-winning Oral History Project, which can be found at www.crestwood.on.ca/ohp. He has been working through the Legion, Sunnybrook and Baycrest for more than a decade now and has chronicled the lives and military experiences of many Legion members during that time. In the summer of 2017 he won a study grant through Alpha Education and was able to travel to China, South Korea, Japan and Vietnam. While there, he documented the testimonies of veterans and survivors in each of those locales, learning about a side of the Second World War that is less well-known in Canadian classrooms.
