Ontario Universities' Application Centre (OUAC) www.ouac.on.ca

- Central online application
- OUAC collects and distributes student data and grade 11 and 12 marks to universities
- OUAC does <u>NOT</u>
 - Offer admission
 - Accept portfolios, supplementary applications, reference letters, etc.





Step #1: Gather Information Needed to Apply

- Guidance team will provide all students with a pin # to access their online OUAC application (<u>Post-</u> <u>Secondary Workshop #3</u>)
- Students will login to their '101' online application
- Complete all demographic sections
- Research and narrow down university program selections





Applying to <u>Ontario Universities</u>

Step #2: Apply

- Add program choices
- Complete all sections of the application
- Review program selections before clicking "I Verify and Agree"
- Submit application, with payment, well before the 101 application deadline

Cost of OUAC Application

- <u>\$150.00</u> for three program choices
- Additional choices are <u>\$50 each</u>
- Easiest payment options are:
 - VISA, MasterCard or American Express
- Students will receive an OUAC Reference Number when they apply *this should be kept in a safe place!*



Step #3: After Applying

- Log in to application to verify the details
- Review and make changes
- Check junk or spam folders
- Email is the primary mode of communication for the universities and the OUAC
- Look out for acknowledgement emails from each university
- Verify grade information at each reporting period



Key Dates

🗹 January 15, 2020

- Deadline for Ontario high school students to submit their completed application to the OUAC
- The initial application includes all final grades from completed Grade 11 and 12 courses and a list of all current-year courses in progress

Why December 6th?

- In mid-January the OUAC website gets very busy and delays may happen
- Changes are possible in December and January using 'Review and Change'
- Select out of province universities will ask for the student's **OUAC** #
- Focus on additional requirements (if applicable) and scholarship applications





A February 4, 2020

 Recommended last date for students to submit university and program changes and additional active choices to the OUAC to be considered for early admission





🗹 May 27, 2020

- The latest date all high school applicants can expect a response from an Ontario university
- This includes:
 - Offer of Admission
 - Alternate Offer
 - Refusal





🗹 June 1, 2020

- The earliest date an Ontario high school student may be required to:
 - Respond to an Ontario
 university offer of admission
 Give a financial commitment
 (e.g., registration and residence deposit)







Mark Transmission Schedule

- October/November:
 - All previously earned Grade 11 and 12 marks and current subjects are sent to the OUAC, along with demographic information
- February:
 - <u>First</u> set of marks for 2019-2020 courses are sent
- April:
 - <u>Second</u> set of marks
- June:
 - <u>Final</u> set of marks
- <mark>July:</mark>
 - <u>Summer school</u> marks





Admission Requirements

- ☑ Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD)
- Minimum overall average in six Grade 12
 U/M courses, including ENG4U
- Prerequisites for admission to specific programs
- Supplementary applications (if applicable)

*Requirements vary by university and specific programs! *

Prerequisites



- Grade Range: <u>87%+</u>
- ENG4U with a minimum mark of 80%
- MCV4U with a minimum mark of 80%
- 1 other 4U course in mathematics with a minimum mark of 80%
- 3 additional 4U or 4M courses

Brock University Business Administration

Prerequisites



- Grade Range: <u>High 70s; Low 80s</u> for Co-op
- ENG4U
- Two 4U maths
- 3 additional 4U or 4M courses

Additional Requirements

- Some programs may require one or more of the following:
 - Profile
 - Essay
 - Reference Letters
 - Interview
 - Portfolio
 - Audition

Prerequisites

- 4U English (ENG4U/EAE4U preferred); 1 of MCF3M, MCR3U, MHF4U, MCV4U, MDM4U); and 1 Grade 12 U or M course in Visual Arts, Canadian and World Studies, Social Sciences and Humanities, Physics or Technological Design
- Students are advised to select Physics (Grade 11 or higher) and the Art option in Grades 11 and 12, if available.
- Preference may be given to students who have included History or Visual Arts/Art History in their Grade 12 U or M studies.

IB and AP Requirements

- IB Admission Information
- AP Admission Information

Additional Admission Criteria Non-academic requirements: Portfolio, personal essay.



Offers of Admission

- <u>Conditional</u> on completing OSSD and six Grade 12 U/M courses
- May have other conditions such as maintaining a **mark average**
- Offers come out at different times for different programs and universities
- Some early offers may be made to students who had a high average in Grade 11 and have completed several Grade 12 courses



Work Experience at University

- Co-op, internship, practicum, field placement
- Additional time may be required
- Paid work experience
- Ex. UWaterloo: students on average earn \$42,000 to \$90,000
- Trying out different careers
- Higher post-grad employment rate and salary attainment



- Students applying to Canadian universities outside Ontario, must
 complete a separate application for each institution
- Accessed directly on each university website

Rolling Admissions

- Ex. Acadia, Mount Allison, Saint Mary's, St. FX
- Students can apply early and have a conditional offer within a few weeks
- Popular programs/residences fill up early, advisable to submit an application to these schools as soon as possible

Step #1: Start Application

- 'Create an Account'
- Fill in personal information and educational history
- Speak to guidance about uploading secondary grades

Step #2: Apply

- Add program
- Review and submit application
- Pay the application fee





Cost of Application

- Non-refundable fee of **\$95.00**
- Up to 5 program choices (no more than 3 at any one college)

Step #3: After Applying

• Log back in to verify transcript information, or to make changes/updates to application





Key Dates

October 2019

• Applications become available for programs starting the following fall

Z February 1, 2020

 Equal Consideration Date – apply to highly competitive programs on or before this date

• Colleges may begin sending offers of admission

• Deadline to confirm offers (colleges may extend offers after this date)

<mark>⊿</mark> Mid-June

• Tuition deposit payment due
