

Course Selection (Gr. 12)

- Students in Grade 12 are required to take a minimum of <u>6 COURSES</u> including one <u>English course</u>
- However, it is recommended that students with only 24 credits (at the end of grade 11) take 7 courses minimum in grade 12
- In order to graduate with the OSSD, students must have a total of 30 credits (18 compulsory + 12 elective)
- Students require a minimum of six (6) Grade 12 University (4U) or University/College (4M) courses for admission to an Ontario university and college
- Students should check https://www.ontariocolleges.ca/en/ for the admissions requirements for specific programs at Ontario universities/colleges and choose courses accordingly



Arts, Social Sciences and Humanities




Although there tend to not be as many required courses for admission to programs in these disciplines, taking a varied selection of courses in high school will help students focus their areas of interest in university.


