Important Vocabulary



- ★ <u>Compulsory Course</u>: This is a specific course you must take that fulfills part of the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) requirements.
- ★ <u>Elective Course</u>: An optional course you can choose to take based on your interest; will count towards your graduation.
- ★ <u>Prerequisite Course</u>: This is a specific course students must successfully complete before taking another course at the next grade level.
- ★ <u>Credit</u>: A credit value of 1.0 is granted upon successfully completing a 110-hour course with a minimum of 50%.






40 hours of community involvement activities

Course Selection (Gr. 9)

- Students in Grade 9 are required to take <u>8</u>

- All students who are completing reach ahead courses are earning credits towards their diploma

Course Selection (Gr. 9)

• ADA1O: Drama, Grade 9 (Open): This course provides opportunities for students to explore dramatic forms and techniques, using material from a wide range of sources and cultures. Students will use the elements of drama to examine situations and issues that are relevant to their lives. Students will create, perform, discuss, and analyse drama, and then reflect on the experiences to develop an understanding of themselves, the art form, and the world around them.



• <u>AMU10: Music, Grade 9 (Open)</u>: This course emphasizes the creation and performance of music at a level consistent with previous experience and is aimed at developing technique, sensitivity, and imagination. Students will develop musical literacy skills by using the creative and critical analysis processes in composition, performance, and a range of reflective and analytical activities. Students will develop an understanding of the conventions and elements of music and of safe practices related to music, and will develop a variety of skills transferable to other areas of their life.



• AVI10: Visual Arts, Grade 9 (Open): This course is exploratory in nature, offering an overview of visual arts as a foundation for further study. Students will become familiar with the elements and principles of design and the expressive qualities of various materials by using a range of media, processes, techniques, and styles. Students will use the creative and critical analysis processes and will interpret art within a personal, contemporary, and historical context.
